Atlanta jeweler Brown & Co. opens uber-luxe watch boutique

It's one of just four boutiques for Patek Philippe in the US

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Tick-tock, time to get your wallets out.

Brown & Co., a decades-old name in the Atlanta jewelry game, is expanding its relationship with exclusive watch brand Patek Philippe. Brown & Co., which celebrated its 50th anniversary last year, not only carries the watches at its growing Buckhead Village campus, but it also has opened a rare, dedicated boutique for the label — one of only four in the country.

Open since late April, the intimate mono-brand salon is located across from Brown & Co.'s main Buckhead Village retail location, behind French eatery Le Bilboquet.

Patek Philippe claims to be the last family-owned Geneva watch manufacturer. Founded in 1839 by Norbert de Patek and Jean Adrien Philippe, the Swiss company has continued production without interruption for nearly two centuries.

Since 1932, the manufacturer has been owned by the Stern family.

The Buckhead boutique takes no more than two appointments at a time to ensure personalized customer service. It features rare timepieces, with some collections having limited global production of a few thousand annually.

The watches can range anywhere in price from \$25,000 to over seven figures.

Brown & Co. courted Patek Philippe for decades

Brown & Co. President Sara Beth Prendeville, daughter of company founder Frank Brown, told Atlanta Business Chronicle the collaboration is 35 years in the making.

Prendeville remembers her father writing a letter to Henri Stern Watch Agency in Manhattan, which manages all business for Patek Philippe in the U.S., every year asking to work with the brand. In 2015, she decided to take mat-

ters into her own hands and cold-called the agency. Due to a mix up, the sales representative engaged with Prendeville before realizing she wasn't who he thought. They exchanged information, and he became Brown & Co.'s first Patek Philippe brand representative.

After two years of getting to know Brown & Co.'s "values" with visits back and forth between Atlanta and New York, the deal was signed, and Brown & Co. began carrying Patek Philippe's watches in 2017. At that point, there were approximately 100 points of sale for Patek Philippe watches in the country. Today, there are around 38, as the brand has seemingly become more selective with its partnerships.

"We are not only so honored and excited to maintain our partnership but also grow it with opening this boutique," Prendeville said.

Prendeville is the latest in her family to lead Brown & Co.
The self-described "Atlanta-proud"

president was born in Roswell and graduated from Auburn University before working at Brown & Co.'s second store, a Buckhead location about a mile away from its current home. (Its original Roswell location is still open.)

Prendeville decided to head to California to attend gemology school before working in San Francisco and then opening the first retail boutique for Swiss watchmaker Breitling in New York City.

In 2013, she officially joined the family business.

Three years ago, Prendeville became president of Brown & Co. She said this "catapulted" her to "make things happen" she felt needed to change. A big portion of that was relocating the Buckhead store.

"We just wanted to be surrounded by more like-minded brands," she said.

Brown & Co. opened in Buckhead Village in September 2023. Prendeville said she believes the development owned by Atlanta-based Jamestown LP has the ideal mix of approachable and high-end brands. "Thanks to its walkability, 'there's not really another place' like the shopping center in the city, she said.

Prendeville has no plans to sell Brown & Co.

She added that Atlanta is a unique retail environment. When many of Brown & Co.'s global partners ask about Atlanta, they want to know where the retail is between the airport and Buckhead.

"Yes, there is [some] outside of the malls, I say, but it's not probably the retail that we would align well with, or at least what we're kind of looking for," she added.

The president of Brown & Co. believes that Atlanta is a unique market because in a lot of other major cities in the country, there are more large independent jewelers.

Prendeville is dedicated to maintaining the company's presence and keeping what she described as "one of the largest independent jewelers" in the country in Georgian hands.

"I feel like I am going to do whatever I can to make sure that we are Atlanta's premier jeweler — that we are quality, we are independent, family-owned, and we're not going to sell," she said.
